Essays may not be used to participate in the oratorical competition.</p> <p>Essays should be well organized and should state the thesis, provide support for arguments, and draw a conclusion.</p> <p>Grades K - 3 essays must be a minimum of 100 words, maximum 500 words. Grades 4 - 12 essays must be a minimum of 500 words, maximum 1000 words.</p> <p>Essays should be typed or neatly printed. Illegible entries will not be judged.</p>

Guidelines	<p>Entrant must submit four (4) copies of oratory speech with a completed application form. Entries submitted without applications will be rejected. Applications should be typed or printed and attached to the back of the speech.</p> <p>Entrants not in compliance with the time restrictions will be penalized.</p> <p>All speeches must be memorized, positive in nature, and theme related. Any help from judges will result in a reduction of points.</p> <p>No props may be utilized during the presentation of the speech.</p> <p>Entrants must be onsite at least 30 minutes before the competition start time.</p> <p>Oratory speeches may not be used to participate in the essay competition.</p>

Time Restrictions	<i>2 minutes max</i>	<i>3 minutes max</i>	<i>4 minutes max</i>	<i>5 minutes max</i>
Performance Divisions	JAZZ - Consists of primarily jazz technique, utilizing up-tempo music. BALLET - Consists of ballet or pointe technique TAP - Consists of tap technique. Tap shoes only. HIP-HOP - Consists of rhythm and blues dance technique SONG/RAP - R&B, Gospel, contemporary, etc. INSTUMENTAL - Piano, violin, clarinet, flute, etc.			
Guidelines	<p>Students competing in the performing arts competition must submit a completed application form. Applications should be typed or printed.</p> <p>Entrants may only compete in one performance division.</p> <p>Point deductions will occur for those not complying with the time restrictions.</p> <p>Teachers/parents of competing dancers will be given reserved seating. However, absolutely no visual coaching is allowed.</p> <p>Props may be used but must be supplied and removed by the entrants. Excessive scenery and special lighting may not be used.</p>			
Mandatory Audition	A mandatory audition for all entrants will take place at 6 pm on Wednesday, January 11, 2011 at: Roosevelt Middle School, 1900 N. Australian Avenue, West Palm Beach, FL 33407. Entrants must audition in order to compete.			
Considerations	Teachers should consider length and choreography in making selections for entries.

Winners may be required to supply the original negative or disc to have a larger photo developed for display.</p>	
Photo Description	<p>A title and brief descriptions should accompany each photo (maximum 300 words). This description should describe the setting, category chosen, and how the photo relates to the category chosen.</p>

Submission Criteria:

- All entries must be the original work of the student
- Poem must be no longer than 40 lines in length
- All entries must be reflective of the theme
- No entries will be accepted that contain profanity, language that is discriminatory (based on race, religion, creed, nationality or gender)
- The students name should be placed only on the cover sheet and should not appear any place on the poem itself
- All entries must be typed
- Plagiarism is considered fraud; any contestant found committing or submitting a poem they did not write themselves will be disqualified
- The judges may disqualify any entry at any time for failing to comply with contest rules

Fee: None

Eligibility: Students attending school in Palm Beach County grade k- 12

Prizes: Will be awarded to the first, second and third place winners; all participants will receive a certificate of participation

Rights: All rights remain the soul property of the author/poet; however, the MLKCC does reserve the right to publish the winning entries on its website, in its newsletter, other affiliated publications & MLK poetry Anthology.

Judges: A panel of seven judges will review all entries – work will be judged on the basis of creativity and originality.

Honorary Judges: In the event of a tie, the tie will be broken by the Honorary Judges.
